Whether or not you are able to come to our assembly on Monday 2nd October we would still appreciate any donations that we could pass on to St Austell Foodbank.

St Austell Foodbank are part of the Trussell Trust and supply three day's worth of nutritionally balanced emergency food and support for those in need. At a time when 1 in 5 people live below the poverty line they are at their busiest. Indeed last year they handed out 2,521 three day emergency food parcels; their highest since they opened in 2010.

At the moment they have plenty of beans and sugar and are most in need of tinned fruit, tea bags, dried pasta, breakfast cereals UHT milk and long life fruit juice. Over 90% of the food they receive is donated by members of the public so these food donations are absolutely vital to help them provide for others.

If you are able to donate any of these items please send them in with your child and we will arrange a collection.
