Online Safety

I wrote about Online Safety in the newsletter last week. There were further issues over the weekend, with children being unkind to one another in group chats. Our advice, and the advice being circulated by all schools, is that you check in regularly with your child's online activity. We are hearing reports of some of the language being used and unkind comments being made - it is highly concerning.

In the Summer Term, I plan to deliver a workshop with parents on how we can support children with navigating the online world. I do not have all the answers, but there have been a growing number of incidences involving Whatsapp, Snapchat, and online gaming. It is having a detrimental impact on the mental health of our young people and therefore we must look to address this.

This week I have included a poster about sharing kindness online. I have also included an information poster about age ratings in response to hearing some of the games children have been playing and television programs/films they have viewed.

The Yr6's Identified the 5 basic tastes which complimented each other before the next lesson where the children planned a 3 course meal which they will make.
















