



There was great excitement among the children last week when we announced that elections for the school and eco council would be held. The school council was relaunched last year, with Miss Singh at the helm. Our school council provides children with a platform to share and discuss their views on how to improve school life.

The school council achieved <u>great success</u> last year. They offered suggestions for our centre courtyard (although we loved the bouncy castle idea, Health and Safety were firmly against it), planted wildflowers around the site, and even kickstarted a campaign to 'Save Water'. They collaborated with Mevagissey Climate Action Group to raise the profile of the school's impact on the environment and identified how we could become a 'greener' school.

The council also had a direct impact on teaching and learning in the classroom. As a staff team, we had questioned whether 99 club was having a positive impact on our pupils. Feedback from the school council highlighted that 99 club was a source of anxiety and discomfort – so we removed it from our curriculum. We believe we have now found a more inclusive approach to the teaching of times tables. This may not have been possible without the direct and clear feedback from the council and the pupils in their classes who they represent.

Democracy is one of the 5 British Values that we focus on in school. Schools are responsible for the teaching of British Values. The hope is that through teaching British Values, children will feel prepared for life in modern Britain as they grow older and leave school.

The other four British Values we teach children are:

- the rule of law
- individual liberty
- mutual respect
- tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs

Through instating a pupil-elected council, every child can put themselves forward for a council position, or directly influence who the successful candidates will be with their vote.

I am sure we can all agree that it takes a huge amount of courage to stand in front of your peers and explain why you would make a great candidate. We must therefore say a massive well done to every child who prepared and delivered a speech in class last week. We hope that those who unfortunately did not get voted in this year try again next year. They will have developed some key skills in writing their speeches and presenting their ideas in front of the class – these skills will undoubtedly help them in the future!

We also want these children to remember that they have a voice and should still actively contribute to the school council. If they are passionate about some improvements they would like to see around the school, they should share this with the school/eco councillors who were voted in by their classmates. This will then be discussed at the next meeting.

And that brings me on to those who will sit on the school council this year. Well done to you all. I am excited to see the magnificent work you do this year to improve our school.

What do the school and eco councillors do?

The school council is a vital part of our school community, ensuring that our pupils have the opportunity to share their thoughts and ideas about their school and the decisions made regarding their learning, school environment and wellbeing at school. We hope to empower every child to feel part of the decision-making process and to create a community feeling in which all pupils feel valued and heard.

Each week our school councillors and eco-councillors will attend a council meeting and will be given the opportunity to speak with their peers during class assembly time. During this time, the school and eco-councillors will feed back the items discussed during the meetings and will also gather the thoughts and ideas from their classmates to be discussed at the next council meeting.

I am excited to hear all of the brilliant thoughts and ideas that our students have this year and look forward to our first council meeting next week.

I would also like to say a massive thank you to our previous school and eco councillors for giving up their time to come to meetings and for doing a fantastic job representing their school last year!

50/50 Club Frequently Asked Questions

What is the "50 / 50 club"? - The 50/50 club is a monthly prize draw run by the PTFA where 50% of cash generated makes up the monthly prizes and 50% goes to the PTFA funds towards essential resources for our school children.

How does it work? - Each member pays £12 for a 50/50 club number for the year, equivalent to £1.00 per month, giving you the chance to win cash in our monthly prize draw. There is no limit to the amount of numbers you can buy and no maximum or minimum number of participants; it is just £12 a year for each membership number.

Who can join? - Membership is open to all parents, carers, staff and supporters of the organisation. Anyone age 16 or over can join.

What do I have to do to enter? - Please complete the attached 50/50 club entry form together with your payment of £12.00, for 12 months. Payment can be made by BACS transfer, annual standing order, cash or cheque. Please return the completed entry form (and payment where appropriate) to a member of the PTFA or the school office by Friday 13th October 2023.

How do I get my number(s)? - Numbers will be allocated once full payment and correctly completed entry forms are received. Your number will be notified by email or text.

When will the prize be drawn? - The prize will be drawn on the last Sunday of each month from October 2023 through to September 2024 at a monthly Facebook live post via the PTFA Facebook page @mevagisseyschoolPTFA. The lucky winner whose number is picked out in the monthly prize draw will win 1/12th of the 50/50 Club prize draw fund. The amount that you will win depends on how many numbers are sold - the more who enter the greater the monthly prize!

We really hope that we can reach a target of 100 members this year. If we did, then that would mean a total income of £1,200.00, so £600.00 would go to the prize fund meaning a monthly prize of £50.00! And equally importantly, £600.00 would go to the PTFA funds, which would go towards essential resources and equipment for our school and children.
