Reading and Writing are great hobbies to pursue.

We know that children who achieve a good standard of reading are better equipped to unlock the wider curriculum. Reading for pleasure, meanwhile, has long been considered as 'the single most important indicator of a child's future success'. Reading develops vocabulary, cultivates independence and fires up the imagination. It fosters a love of words and broadens vocabularies. We learn through reading, deepening knowledge and understanding.

While all of the above is at the forefront of our minds when designing our English Curriculum and refining our teaching practice, it is crucial that we remember the wider benefits of reading and writing.

We often speak about the escapism that a great book offers; we know that reading is a valuable tool in reducing stress and promoting well-being. To cut a long story short, the many benefits of reading are widely recognised!

But what about the benefits of creative writing?

I once heard reading described as 'breathing in' and writing described as 'breathing out' – this has stayed with me over the years. Creative Writing not only allows us to live in someone else's shoes, it gives us the freedom and power to decide in which direction those shoes walk. Like all the teachers here at Mevagissey, I love creative writing and it is my favourite lesson to teach. It is a highlight of a teacher's day when we see a child read back their work and smile with pride – impressed with their own writing skill.

This brings me on to the BBC 500 Word Competition...

The BBC 500 Word Competition is back. This year, we are hoping to get all the children involved. In Year 6, we will be writing a 500-word story linked to Holes, our class novels. It will be a Western Adventure story and I know the children will be desperate to pen some masterpieces.

What is the BBC 500 Word Competition?

Since the competition was first launched in 2011 by Chris Evans on the Radio 2 Breakfast Show, it has received over one million stories from children throughout the UK.

This year, the two age categories will be 5-7 year-olds and 8-11 year-olds.

Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to write a story they would love to read without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Our brilliant 500 Word judges are back: award-winning and best-selling authors Frank Cottrell-Boyce, Francesca Simon, Charlie Higson, and former children's laureate, Malorie Blackman. We are delighted to say that this year there will be a new addition to the panel, TV legend, children's author and World Book Day ambassador, Sir Lenny Henry. The judges will be casting their expert eyes over the final 50 stories. You can find out why they are perfect judges here.

We are also very lucky that once again the competition has been given the royal seal of approval and has the support of Her Majesty, The Queen

This year, BBC Breakfast will be hosting the competition supported by us on BBC Teach. The winners will be featured in a special 500 Word programme with The One Show, on World Book Day on 7 March 2024.

Our very own Miss Ashley-Cooper has also been confirmed as a judge for this prestigious competition!

Image prompts are a great way of stimulating the imagination. Children and parents alike, set a fifteen-minute timer and write about the image below. Where do the stairs lead? What can you smell? Is the main character frightened or curious? Can the main character hear footsteps? Is the main character being followed? Enjoy!


