



Last week, I wrote about the importance of reading and how passionate we are about instilling a love of reading in our pupils to ensure that when they leave us at the end of their primary journey, they are fluent and confident readers.

On Thursday, we were surprised and delighted to receive a letter from the minister for schools, Damian Hinds. The letter recognizes the outstanding outcomes that the Year 1 pupils achieved in their phonics screening test last summer. 100% of children passed the check. The letter states that this puts Mevagissey Primary in the top 1% of schools in the country for this set of data outcomes.

I feel incredibly proud of the children and the staff for their exceptional hard work in making the highly ambitious aim of 100% achievement a reality. This is a remarkable and rare feat.

From the outset, the intent has been clear from the adults who lead the RWI groups and deliver daily intervention: every child, with the right support and with positive encouragement, can pass this test.

The phonics results are testament to the extraordinary efforts of the RWI team, who work with the children every single day, helping them on their first steps to becoming readers. It's hard to express in words the passion they display every day.

This achievement would not have been possible without the eagerness to learn we see from the children in each and every lesson. They are sponges for new learning. They grow in resilience every day and we all feel so fortunate to work here at Mevagissey School with them.

We need to also say a huge thank you to parents, grandparents and carers, who play a massive role in supporting children with their learning at home – listening to them read, using the RWI portal resources sent out by the teachers and encouraging them to reach their potential.

I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 100 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at Mevagissey Community Primary School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.


