#### This week at School Headteacher's message

I wanted to start the newsletter this week by sharing some excellent news. A few weeks ago, I attended a Mevagissey Parish Council meeting to seek financial support to help ease the burden of the ever-increasing cost of coach fares, I was fortunate enough to be joined by many of our PTFA volunteers, who spoke brilliantly on behalf of the school – describing how an increasing percentage of the money they have raised is being invested in coach travel, so that our children can participate in sporting fixtures and have access to all the exciting and memorable school trips that are such an important part of their primary school education.

I thought it would be nice to share just a small sample of the experiences that we have been able to offer the children, often due to the hard work of the PTFA: Minack Theatre, Newquay Aquarium, Truro Museum, Camel Creek, Newquay Zoo, Eden Project, Penrice to watch a show, Football, Netball and Cross Country events, Farm and Country Show at the Royal Cornwall Showground, a recent trip for Year 1 and 2 to Beacon Vetcare in Summercourt.

Last year, we spent just under  $\pm 9,000$  on coach travel. This is a staggering figure, but not such a surprise when we are being quoted  $\pm 290,00$  for an 11-minute, 5-mile journey to Pondhu School for sports fixtures.

We were so pleased that the Parish Council recognised the challenges we are facing and agreed to support us. This will ensure that we can still offer a curriculum that not only focuses on the importance of quality teaching and learning, but also on providing wider experiences that are fun and enriching. Furthermore, now the money being raised by the PTFA can be redirected – new sporting kits are being designed, trips and visits are being planned – but, above all, we are desperate to re-stock the library with new books.

In November 2024, the Annual Literacy Survey found that 1 in 3 children between 8-18 enjoy reading. This is the lowest sine the survey started in 2005. Just 34.6% of children in the survey said they enjoyed reading. I find this so scary. In my opinion, there is nothing better than the joy of a great book. We live in a world where books, for many children, are sadly being replaced by the temptations of screens and gaming. As adults who work with and care for children, I believe we have a huge responsibility to keep the magic of reading alive. I would need umpteen pages to list the benefits and importance of reading for children, Please keep reading with your children, talking to them about how specials books are – and we will continue to do our very best to share with the children how important stories are, how they can make you feel, how they can transport you to another world, place and time. Have a great weekend – let's hope the sun sticks around. Mr Ringrose
