



Thank you for your support during the events of yesterday. As you know, we value attendance in school highly. We know how much learning happens every day in school. It was therefore a very difficult decision to shut for the day. However, we had to consider the safety of our entire school community and we would not have been able to forgive ourselves if anyone had found themselves in difficulty when travelling home. Furthermore, the moment we knew that fellow CELT schools were closing, particularly those in the St Austell area, we knew that the conditions closer to town must have been problematic. Taking into account that we had a number of families and staff travelling in that direction, I felt it was the right thing to do.

Ensuring the children have the tools to remain safe on the internet is one of the biggest challenges schools face in the modern world. The teaching of online safety features heavily in the Mevagissey curriculum. We teach online safety predominantly through PSHE and Computing. We also celebrate National Online Safety Day (Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024). Assemblies are used as a great opportunity to explore what staying safe online means for our school community. We have also selected our class novels with care, ensuring that important themes such as online safety are presented to children in the form of story.

Last week, we spoke to the children in small groups, outside of the classroom, listening to their views about the school and life in general. We also had teachers and headteachers from several different schools join us for this. I have taken these quotes from the report of the visit, which I received recently. Some of these quotes made me smile:

'All pupils feel teachers are respectful to them, using phrases like "adults listen to us".

When discussing bullying, children shared the following: 'All students said bullying, although it can happen, was rare. All students say if someone is bullied then action is taken. They gave a couple of examples. All students said if they saw someone being bullied then they would report it and it would be dealt with by a teacher'.

'All pupils were enthusiastic about the engagement approaches and used them all the way through our session—they explained build, challenge, agree and the thinking fist and talked about the sentence starters that they use to help them'.

Pupils enjoy buddy reading—'it makes me feel good to help the younger children and it's why I want to be a teacher'.

However, I would like to share a piece of feedback from the children that I feel we all need to be aware of: 'Pupils identified that there is sometimes a problem with text/WhatsApp messages outside of school but knew they needed to tell an adult if that happens.' Another, separate sample group said, 'there is some online bullying where children are nasty to one another. This happens on WhatsApp. They say there are various group chats'.

It is reassuring that children feel confident speaking to an adult when they have concerns about Whatsapp groups, but this continues to be a real challenge for young people. It is our responsibility to help support and educate them on appropriate interactions both online and offline.

We have a fantastic resource called National Online Safety that we use as a staff team. It provides access to some excellent materials that better-prepares us to support children with the challenges they face with modern technology. Our subscription allows parents to access these material. Please find information below to sign up.


