



Happy New Year to you all! We hope you all had a lovely Christmas break.

The first school week of 2024 has whizzed by. The children have settled back into school life brilliantly, with a positive attitude to learning and the classrooms have been buzzing with enthusiastic learning and catching up with friends and working hard in class.

I have been lucky enough to spend the week in Sea Turtles with the Year 6 pupils. We have spent much of the week talking about reading: discussing our favourite books, unpicking why reading is important, and thinking about the unrivalled joy you can take from a great book.

There is a broad body of educational research that has identified strong links between future employment prospects and reading from a young age. While this serves as a reminder of the enormous importance of teaching children to read, at Mevagissey, we feel strongly that igniting a love of reading is worth so much more. In an age where children are surrounded by the lure of electronic devices, it is has never been more important to promote the power of books.

I have been so impressed with the attitude of the Year 6 children this week who have committed chunks of their evening to reading and, in many cases, finished entire books! Best of all, the children have all exclaimed passionately how much they enjoyed those longer reading sessions! I know this is also happening throughout the school as Miss Bailey and I, along with all of the class teachers, keep a close eye on how much reading is happening each week. Accelerated Reader helps us identify children who are quizzing and those who are not, so that we can help to support those who are perhaps not reading as regularly as they could be. But, this is something we need your help with. Reading for 20 minutes a day can have such a positive impact.


"Children who read 20 minutes a day/5 days a week are exposed to 1.8 million words in one school year. Compare this to students who read 5 minutes per day – they will be exposed to 282,000 words per school year. Reading helps foster empathy – a child experiences "walking in someone else's shoes."

I have written about reading before, and no doubt I will write about it again, because there is a strong argument that the most important gift we can give the children is a love of reading that they will carry with them for the rest of their lives.




