Our Gardening Club were invited to take part in National Tree Week by Cornwall Council.

Every tree planted in Cornwall goes towards the Forest for Cornwall which is increasing biodiversity, improving green spaces for residents and helping the region reach net zero.

Since the programme was launched four years ago the Forest for Cornwall has reached more than 600,000 trees the equivalent of a tree for every resident.

There are a variety of tree-planting events taking place throughout National Tree Week which takes place from November 25 to December 3.

The children helped with the whole process of digging the hole, planting the tree, cutting the supports and putting them into the ground and then protecting them with a wire mesh. All of their hard work paid off and they were rewarded with hot drinks, biscuits and Christmas Chocolates!













We held our Rocksteady Concert this week! The children did amazingly well performing in front of their parents—I think we may have the next future rock stars in our midst!














#### Reception class have made their own Christmas Stars


